




WTC Utah Observations

May 2013: Utah's traditional export strength was heavily affected in May by a large drop in gold prices-- despite almost doubling our shipment by volume over the same period last year. On a positive note, Utah continues its export growth to emerging markets, including quadrupling our exports to China (216% MOM). Major Utah exports to China include: Primary Metals (\$304M YTD), Computer & Electronics (\$268M YTD), and Machinery (\$23M YTD).
